The Education Department is proud to announce that the Business Committee has added additional funds of \$1600.00 to the Higher Education Scholarship fund of \$1400.00 per student. Which makes a total of \$3,000 for a full time student. We are also accepting application for graduate students. The deadlines

for the Higher Education Scholarship are <u>July 15th</u> for fall students and <u>December 15th for spring</u> students. You must have an lowa CDIB, attending an accredited 2 year or 4 year institution, and have a 2.0 GPA or Higher to qualify for the scholarship.

The Adult Vocational Training program has also increased the \$500 assistance for Vocational Training to a total limit of \$1000 annually. Strawberry Boiled Bread

1/2 cup fresh or frozen strawberries crushed (if using crushed dried strawberries use 3/4 cup)

1/2 cup cornmeal, approximately

1/2 cup corn flour, approximately

1/2 cup walnuts, chopped or crushed

1/2 cup hazelnuts, chopped or crushed

1/2 cup water

Maple syrup to taste



Using a large bowl, mix all the ingredients together. Then moisten the dry mixture with water if needed and stir. Form round patties with the thick mixture. If mixture seems too wet add more corn flour or corn meal.

Rapidly boil water in a deep saucepan. Then one at a time, drop the strawberry patties into the water, keeping a constant boil (depending on pan size, you can make 3 or 4 at a time). Watch closely for 5 minutes.

Once the patties float to top, they should be ready.

Carefully remove the patties from the saucepan with a slotted spoon, as they will be fragile.

Cool before eating.




WELLNESS UPDATE




GREAT JOB JACOB!






The Mouth: A Gateway to Health

Did you know that a healthy mouth is associated with overall health? Infection and inflammation in your teeth and gums can negatively affect the rest of your body, including increasing risk and severity of many diseases such as diabetes and cardiovascular disease to name a few(1). Also, the mouth often holds the first indications that something is going on elsewhere in the body.

Many studies have linked periodontal disease - or gum disease - to systemic health problems. Periodontal disease is "a bacterial infection that destroys the attachment fibers and supporting bones that hold the teeth in the mouth. Left untreated, periodontal disease can lead to tooth loss. The main cause of periodontal disease is bacterial plaque, a sticky, colorless film that constantly forms on teeth"(2).

Progression of Gum Disease



How Do I Prevent Periodontal Disease?

- Brush your teeth at least twice daily
- Floss daily
- Eat a healthy diet and replace sugary snacks with vegetables
- Schedule twice yearly checkups and cleanings with your dental office. This allows us to do a full exam to detect possible disease, etc.

Perkins Family Clinic has recently received a dental grant focusing on periodontal disease. With it, we purchased new equipment and medications aimed at increasing the success of our treatment of the disease. Make an appointment with
