

Ioway Casino Construction Begins

Perkins, OK – A recent article about the temporary casino being built by the Iowa Tribe contained information that was gathered from outdated sources. The Tribe is no longer associated with Lakes Entertainment of Minneapolis, Minn.; the Iowa Tribe will own and operate the new Ioway Casino, which will be located a few miles west of Chandler on historic Route 66. The temporary casino will have about 250 slot machines and a small snack area. The Ioway Casino will open this summer and will have a positive impact on the surrounding communities by employing close to 70 staff members.

"There are plans for a much larger, permanent casino to be built on the Iowa Tribe's land; however specific details about the size and scales of the operation are not yet finalized." said Stephan Burris, General Manager, Cimarron Casino. Information recently quoted from the 2007 Environmental Assessment by the National Gaming Commission was prepared for casino plans that had been developed by Lakes Entertainment. These plans were dropped when the Iowa Tribe severed its business relationship with the Minneapolis, Minnesota casino management company.

The Iowa Tribe also owns and operates the Cimarron Casino located in Perkins, Oklahoma which is currently undergoing a multi-million dollar expansion as well.

Eligibility: Current full-time technical undergraduate and graduate student intems will have first-hand experience with existing tribal renewable energy projects and exposure to issues concerning tribal renewable energy technology use and application. Several DOE Tribal Energy Program (TEP) technical assistance projects are progressing and maybe incorporated into the summer's activities. Interactions will be with Sandia's renewable energy program staff and American Indian tribes interested in renewable energy systems. Instant immersion in these activities is offered in working directly with experienced peers. Frequent travel will be required with field visits to current tribal renewable energy projects.

Required: The student applicant must be a US Citizen and there is a preference for a Native American as defined as a member of a recognized Federally-recognized Tribe, Alaska Village or Alaska Corporation (not staterecognized, not bands or groups, or first peoples of Guam or Hawaii). Specific interest in renewable energy is required.

Required GPA: 3.2 Bachelor's or 3.5 Master's degree program

Required essays: Answer ALL of the following questions using up to 250 words per question.

- What unique academic background or experience do you have with tribal communities? (250 words)
- What is your interest in renewable energy or energy efficiency classes & include class experience? (250 words)
- How will you use this internship experience to benefit tribal communities? (250 words)
- Describe a frustrating project you worked on & describe how you dealt with the challenges it presented. (250 words)

NOTE: Applicants must pass a pre-employment security check (local & federal law enforcement, driver's history, personal references, educational, credit & employment checks).

Apply electronically through Sandia National Laboratories website. Submit ONE electronic file including:

- ✓ Resume / CV
- ✓ Unofficial college transcripts
- ✓ Complete essays using up to 250 words per question

Salary & Relocation Expenses:

- Salary commensurate with number of hours completed by the end of the 2012 Fall semester in an appropriate technical major
- Sandia will pay relocation expenses (mileage and per diem or round-trip airfare) for a school site > 50 miles from Albuquerque, New Mexico
