he Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma and Perkins Family Clinic (PFC) will hold its 11th annual Health Fair, "March to a Healthy Nation" scheduled for Friday, June 17th from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. The Health Fair will be held opening day of the Iowa Nation Pow wow, which will be June 17-19th. The event at the Bah-Kho-Je Chena building at the Iowa Tribal Pow-Wow Grounds, located five miles south of Hwy 33, Perkins on State Highway 177. The health fair will proudly salute to the Iowa Tribe's Veteran Warriors program during lunch.

The event hosted by the lowa Tribe and Perkins Family Clinic will kick off at 10 am the *Patriot Riders* will be on hand to honor our veterans; the Presentation of the Flag will be by our Bah Kho Je Veteran Warriors,.

Terrie Wright, Community Health Nurse, said the free health fair will have a variety

of services offered by the Iowa Tribe such as Elders Program, Education and Job Placement, Vocational rehabilitation services, Perkins Family Clinic medical and dental services. Outside vendors including a Inter Tribal Buffalo Council from Rapid City, SD; Smokey the Bear, Bureau of Indian Affairs, PFC health screenings, Payne County Wellness Coalition, Veteran benefit and enrollment services, Grey Snow Eagle Aviary, and more. Free Lunch will be provided.

"Over 25 health venders have registered who will offer giveaways and there will be drawings every 15 minutes," Wright said.

The Oklahoma Blood Institute will also be on hand for a blood drive during the health fair.

"We will be having a blood drive in conjunction with our health fair and OBI will be there," Wright said. "If people will call and register now and we have over 20 people donating they will bring out another blood drive van."

"We are really excited about our Veteran warrior program," she said. "The VA will be there providing several booths about benefits for our veterans. Native singers and drums will perform to honor our Veteran Warriors during lunch."

Wright, who has been a registered nurse for 30 years, said the free health fair is open to anyone. She said the event is designed to offer

he lowa Tribe of Oklahoma and services to help make for a healthier community.

"I think we should be proactive instead of reactive to our health," Wright said. "We are trying to educate the community on health awareness. The healthy choices we make will help change people's lives, which will affect their families and their communities.

The mission of the Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma Health's Division is to "Care for the Whole Community."

The Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma Vocational Rehabilitation Program attended Pawnee Nation College Commencement on Friday May 13, 2016.

During the Special Awards, Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma Vocational Rehabilitation Program was the only program to have the privilege and honor of receiving the Certificate of Recognition COMMUNITY ADVOCATE OF THE YEAR 2016.

In year 2014 Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma Vocational Rehabilitation program was honored with a certificate of providing community service to the Pawnee community for the work Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma Vocational Rehabilitation does.

lowa Tribe of Oklahoma Vocational Rehabilitation Program (ITOVR) began in 1994. At that time, Iowa Tribe had the distinction of being only one of four in Oklahoma. The other three were Cherokee Nation, Choctaw Nation, Apache Tribe of Oklahoma and the Iowa Tribe of Oklahoma, which had a staff of two employees a Director and Administrative Assistant.

It has now grown to staff of four: Rose Malone Director, Rowana Condry VR Counselor, Ron Baker VR

Counselor and Christa Tsotaddle VR Transition Counselor.

ITOVR covers seven counties: Kay, Lincoln, Logan, Noble, Pawnee, Payne, and Potawatomie.

This program is a five year grant and is funded from U.S Department of Education. TOVR's previous staff and staff now have written all ITOVR grants. ITOVR is in its fifth cycle (22 years) and will be starting its 23rd year October 01, 2016. Upon completion of this grant September 30, 2019, ITOVR will be in existence for 25 years. ITOVR staff will begin gathering grant information to start writing for its sixth cycle October 01, 2019- September 30, 2024.


And finally, at the 'end of the year awards assembly', Daniel had received an award for outstanding English II Pre-AP student and a medial for top Algebra II.

trying new things. I decided that it would be fun to try horseback riding, my parent had a horse but he was lame and we couldn't ride him in fear that he would get further injuries.


I contacted Casie of the Natural Resource Division and she set us up with Wendy of the


